Jubilee Year of Mercy

Pope Francis has declared a Jubilee Year, a Holy Year to celebrate MERCY. Pope Frances envisions a year when people will become more merciful in their own lives and bring God's mercy to others. 'Opening the door' is a great symbol of warmth, hospitality, welcoming, being 'at home' and forgiveness......this is Mercy.

For the jubilee year of Mercy individual churches as well as whole towns have been designated as pilgrimage sites for the Diocese of Jackson. Christ the King Catholic Church in Southaven has been designated as one of the pilgrimage sites in the Diocese of Jackson. In the calendar, several days are labeled as Pilgrimage Days. On those days, pilgrims may gain an indulgence for attending the pilgrimage site, praying for the Holy Father's intentions, and participating in the Mass.

Confessions will be available on those pilgrimage days. Our next pilgrimage days will be Saturday and Sunday, April 23/24. The Church will be open from 8am to 8pm. July 28, September 3/4, November 5/6 and November 12/13 are other designated days.



RCIA Who is most important in the process of becoming a Catholic? Of bringing someone to the table of the Lord? (besides God). When asked this question, many give the answer 'candidate, sponsor, parents, catechists, priests, etc.)

Almost everyone comes because someone else **INVITED** them. And who are those 'someones'? Some-times a spouse, sometimes a person at work, sometimes a teen age friend, sometimes a grandma or grandpa, some-times a fallen away Catholic in their family in the past, sometimes a new baby! Maybe a priest or sister......but usually not. Remember **SHEEP MAKE SHEEP!**

Sometimes we assign a task to a priest or sister that they truly cannot do effectively. Yes, the priest preaches; the sister teaches BUT it is usually to the people who are already here!

So the answer to our question who is most important is clearly THE ASSEMBLY, the people in the benches. Does the assembly KNOW this? (Do you?)

When a parish staff decides to begin an RCIA process or when the Bishop expects every parish to have an RCIA process, the main question to ask: Is the ASSEMBLY ready for RCIA. Do they know what is expected of them? (What about our parishes? What do we still need to know?)

In the weeks to come we will examine the elements expected in the preparation of the Rites.

Meantime, rejoice with our elect, those chosen and called

by our God. And welcome them into our midst as fully initiated Catholics at the Easter Vigil.
