Hello,

I am writing to thank you for your financial support and volunteers that assisted with the 5 Loaves and 2 Fish Summer Outreach program in our community and give you a glimpse of how you made a difference in the lives of children and families this summer. Through the support of individuals and some of our area churches working together, we were able to provide food to assist an average of 35 families this summer. Besides, parents/guardians/older siblings, we reached 212 children who faced food insecurities this summer. There was no way any one of us or an individual church could have accomplished this. This happened and children were fed out of Christian love and concern because we worked together.

As one who worked closely with this program, I heard the appreciation and the gratitude the families expressed as they picked up the boxes of food on the last day of distribution for the summer. A mother with three small children was so excited that we had toilet paper included in the pick up that day. Her little girl asked me as we were loading the car, “Is there cereal in the box? We don't have any, and I really like cereal especially the round kind.”

Another blessing of the summer was the volunteers from the different churches coming together to pack the boxes and bag the produce for distribution each time. Several people commented on how much they enjoyed working together with people from other churches in our area.

This is just a glimpse of how I have seen God at work through our efforts over the past few weeks. God is good and amazing things happen when God's people come together and respond.

So, thank you again for your involvement with this pilot program this summer through your gifts of time, prayers, and financial support. May we continue to see others with the eyes of Christ and share Christ's love with all especially those in need of some of the basic needs of life.
